Gilmore Story

An inspiration to the Key Brothers was Roscoe Turner of Corinth, Mississippi. Turner was a stunt pilot who dressed in a military-style uniform. He was sponsored by the Gilmore Oil Company, whose mascot was a lion. So, Turner purchased a lion cub and named him Gilmore. Gilmore was on board Turner's Lockheed Air Express when he set a transcontinental speed record from Los Angeles to New York City in 1930.

Lesson ideas:

- Retell this story from Gilmore's point of view (RI5.6)
- Define the following vocabulary words and find synonyms and antonyms for them.(L5.4) Vocabulary- stunt, sponsored, mascot, purchased, transcontinental
- Explain the connection between Gilmore to Meridian and the importance of this connection. (Further research required.) (RI5.3)
