Noon Year's Eve is included with \$10 general admission and free with museum membership. The museum will be closed on Dec. 24, 25, 31 and Jan. 1. Museum hours are Tuesday-Saturday, 9:00 a.m. -5:00 p.m. and Sunday, 1:00-6:00 p.m. *Journey to the North Pole*, MCM's holiday exhibit will be open until Jan. 7.

- 45-foot Snowflake Slide (Must be 36" to ride)
- Reindeer Rink sock skating (Must bring socks for this experience)
- Magical train cars, a child-sized post office, letters to Santa, holiday train table with toy trains and village elements
